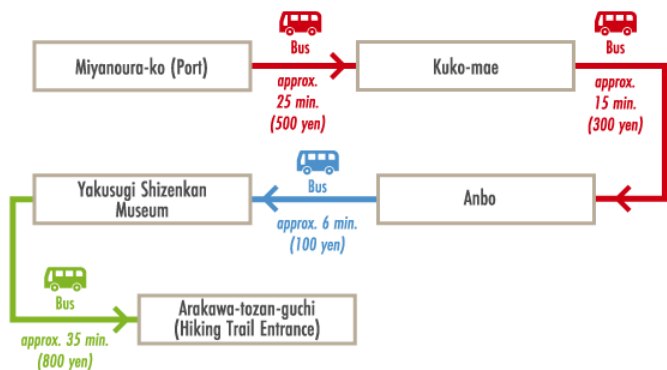




Jomonsugi Cedar

Access



※Required times and charges are approximate



Nagata to Ohko-no-taki Waterfall route

- Approx. 24 single journeys daily
- There are fewer buses running between Nagata to Miyanouura and Ohko-no-taki Waterfall to Yakusugi Shizenkan Museum.

Kigensugi Cedar/ Yakusugi Land route

- 2 journeys daily: 1 each in the morning and afternoon
- Journey time approx. 1 hr.

Arakawa Tozan Bus route

- 5 journeys daily (6 during summer vacation)
- Journey time approx. 35 min.
- This is a shuttle bus to Arakawa Hiking Trail Entrance. It is necessary to purchase the "Arakawa-tozan-guchi bus ticket" at least a day in advance.

Basic information

•Time

4 hr. 25 min. return journey (allow an additional 1 to 2 hours break)

•Distance

Approx. 22.0 km

•Fund contribution

Mountain-climbing notification is required (forms available at the airport, ports, and tourist information centers). 300 yen to the Forest Environmental Enhancement Promotion Fund.

Good points to know

□ Set off early in the morning

A lengthy 22 km return journey that takes more than 10 hours on a day trip. For a safe hiking experience, it is necessary to begin hiking at dawn and start your descent by 1pm.

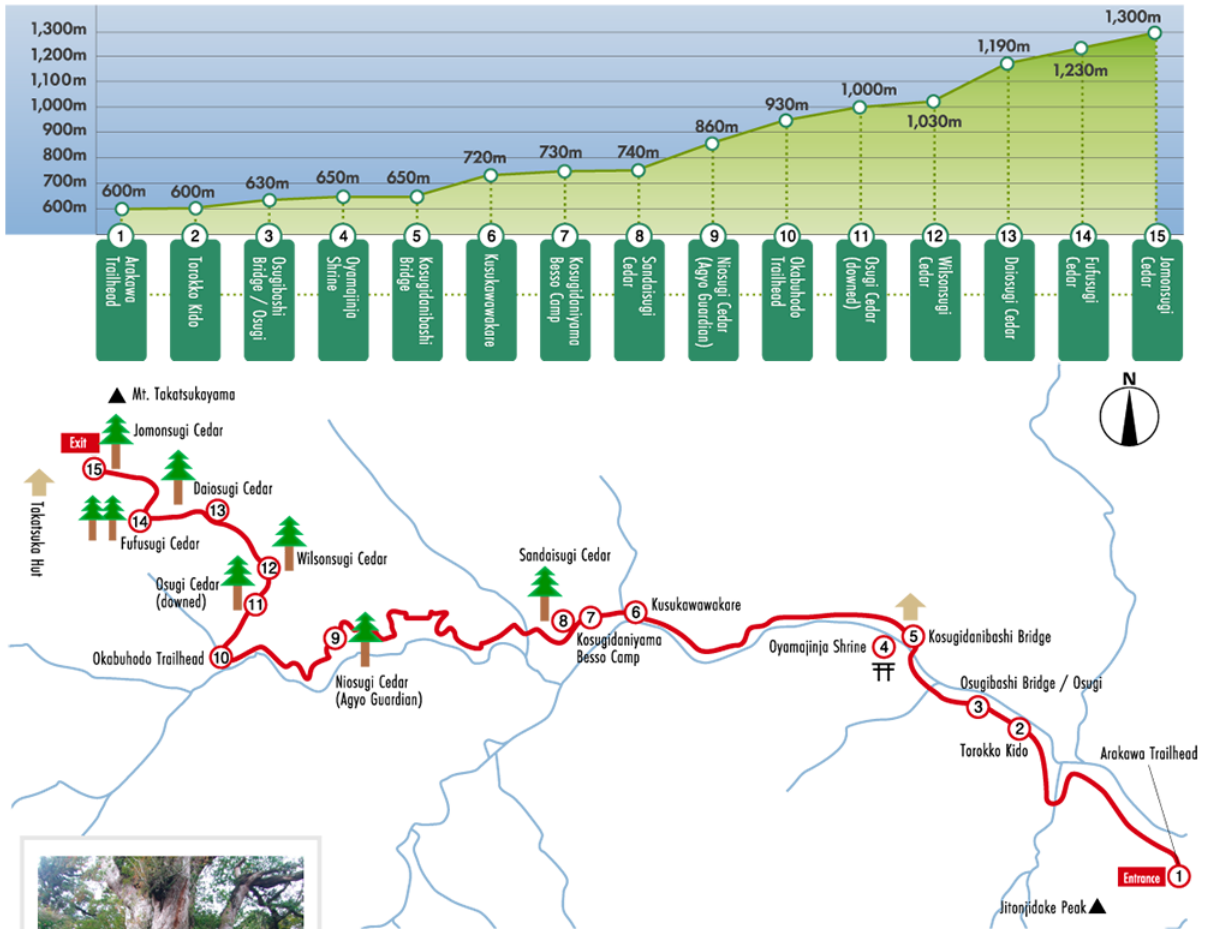
□ Reserve Arakawa Tozan Bus tickets and lunch boxes the day before

Tozan Bus tickets must be purchased in advance from tourist information centers, lodging facilities, or Yakusugi Shizenkan Museum. Lunch boxes can be reserved the previous day with your lodging facility.

Example of itinerary

3:00	Depart lodging facility
4:00	Receive lunch box and board bus
4:30	Arrive at Yakusugi Shizenkan Museum
4:40	Board Arakawa Tozan Bus
5:20	Arrive at Arakawa Hiking Trail Entrance
6:00	Start hike

Jomonsugi Cedar

The oldest Yakusugi cedar that was discovered in 1966. Its exact age is unknown, but estimates range from 2,700 to 7,000 years old. Its divine, commanding presence is sure to move the hearts of all.



Wilson's Stump

A Yakusugi cedar stump discovered by biologist Ernest Wilson. Looking upwards when inside the hollow stump, you can see a heart-shaped sky.



Railway track path

The famous railroad track that stretches for 8 km on the 11 km long trail to Jomonsugi Cedar. Walk within the rails to avoid slip and fall accidents.



Arakawa Hiking Trail Entrance

The starting point of your hike. There are flush toilets and a rest area.

Caution

•Toilets

There are 3 toilets on this trail, including 1 at the trailhead. As the toilets may see long queues, it is best to prepare a disposable toilet bag (there are toilet huts for their use).

•Breaks and meals

Take breaks and meals around the remains of the Kosugidani settlement, at the start of Okabu Trail, and near Wilson's Stump.

•Mobile phone

There is little to no reception of mobile phone signal. Public telephones are available at Arakawa Juncture and Yakusugi Land.
