



Izumi Farm Stay Experience



Experience country-living in Japan, something you won't find in larger cities. There is abundant nature; there is deep history. Famers are waiting to welcome you with a smile.



- Only one group per day at each farm.
- Farmers will greet you at Izumi Station, a Shinkansen stop.
- Farmers providing accommodation will treat you like relatives.
- There are many things to enjoy on each farm, including star-strewn sky, wild deer, and homecooked meals, as well as farming experience.
- Having drinks with dinner with the farmers is also the appeal of Nou-haku (farm stay)
- •You can also enjoy sightseeing in Izumi with them.



Recommended overnight course

- Nowhere else in the world can you see tens of thousands of white-necked and hooded cranes take wings from November to March.
- Wearing a kimono or a yukata in the samurai residences (fees apply / kimono from October to April, yukata from May to September) Women may keep the kimono as souveniers.
- With the kimono on, tour the Samurai Residences, the largest of their kind in Japan, on an oxcart.

For lunch on the second day, you will be able to enjoy a local delicacy "Izumi Oyako Steak Gohan" (chicken steak) made with a double-yolk egg and Izumi's brand of chicken.

Day 1, A Farming Experience and Homestay

You can experience working on a farm that grows mandarin oranges, vegetables, rice, and tea, or one that raises cattle and enjoy feasting on meals prepared by the farmers.



You are free to bring in alcoholic beverages at dinner.

Day 2, History and Culture Greeting and farewell at **Exploration** Izumi Station, a Shinkansen stop.

Explore Izumi's Samurai Residences from the Edo period 400 years ago, while getting in touch with Japan's beautiful kimono culture and wearing one and savor the Japanese ambiance by riding an old-fashion oxcart.



Japan's top wintering spot for cranes

10,000 cranes taking wings is a spectacle you can only see in Izumi

Over 10,000 cranes migrate from Siberia from mid-October to December and stay until March each year to winter in Izumi, Japan's most significant wintering spot for cranes. The number and variety of migration are the largest in Japan, and the "cranes of Kagoshima and their wintering spot" are designated as the nation's special national treasures. Over 10,000 cranes taking wings in the early morning are a spectacle you can see nowhere else in

Savor the ambiance of Japan

Wearing kimono (yukata) and tea ceremony in the samurai residences

Would you like to stroll through the streets that retain the character of the old Edo period in a kimono? In this tour, you can choose a kimono and obi(sash belt) in the patterns you like from among many and have staffs dress you in a samurai residence. Once you change into a kimono, let's savor the art of Japanese tea ceremony while enjoying the view of the beautiful garden. You will have japanese sweet and matcha tea while receiving instructions on etiquette. The end of the tour, female customers can take away the kimono and obi(sash belt) as souvenirs which will remind you of the trip.
