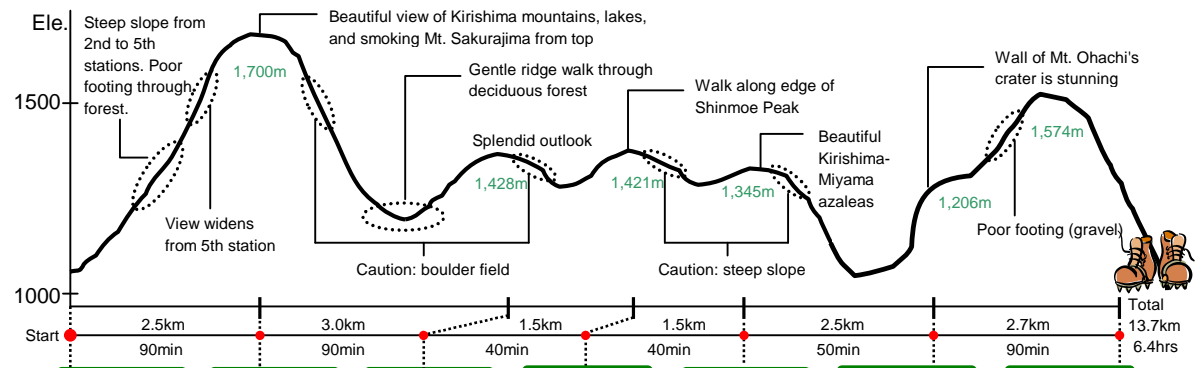
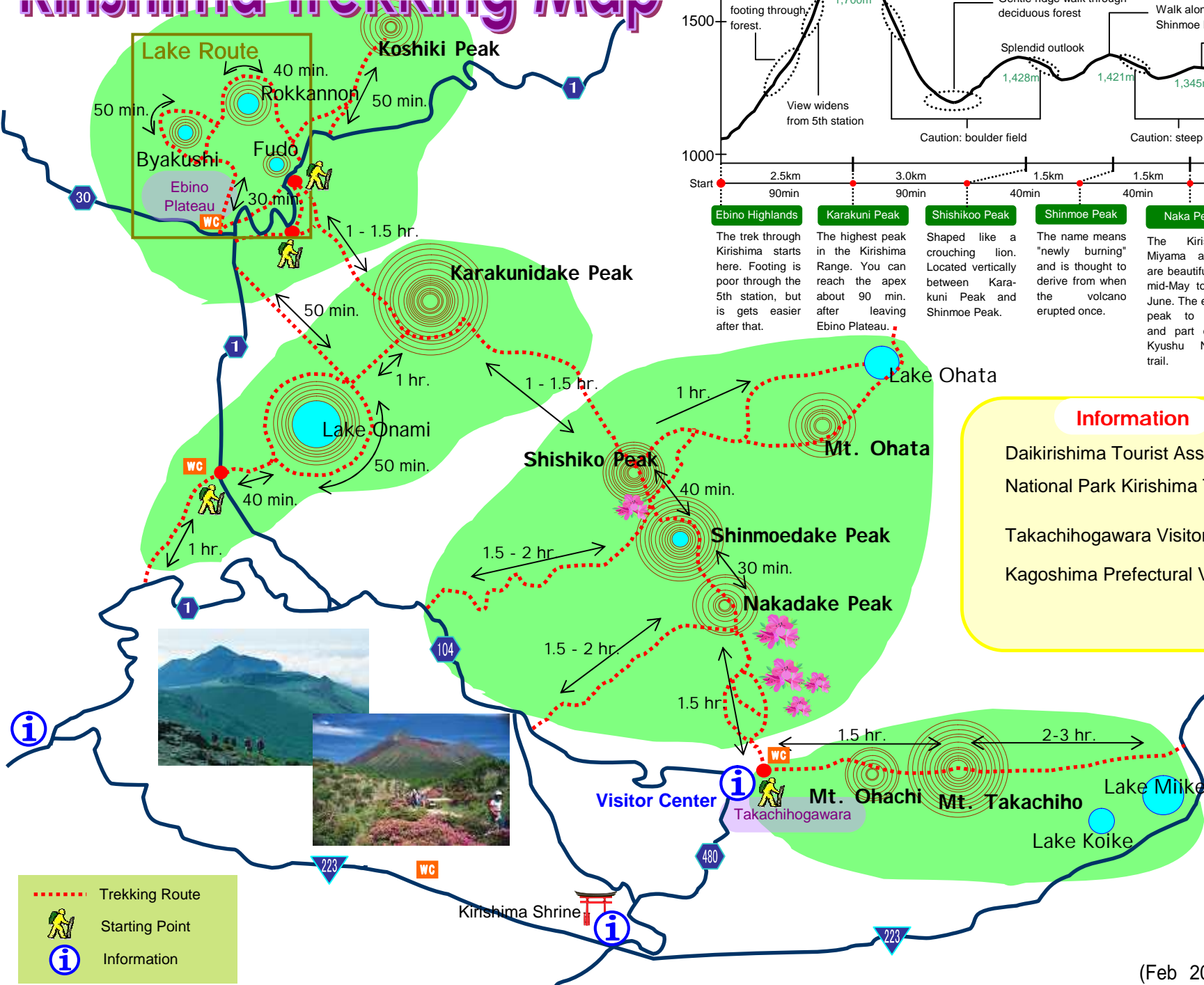


Kirishima Trekking Map



- Ebino Highlands**
The trek through Kirishima starts here. Footing is poor through the 5th station, but it gets easier after that.
- Karakuni Peak**
The highest peak in the Kirishima Range. You can reach the apex about 90 min. after leaving Ebino Plateau.
- Shishikoo Peak**
Shaped like a crouching lion. Located vertically between Karakuni Peak and Shinmoe Peak.
- Shinmoe Peak**
The name means "newly burning" and is thought to derive from when the volcano erupted once.
- Naka Peak**
The Kirishima-Miyama azaleas are beautiful from mid-May to early June. The easiest peak to climb, and part of the Kyushu Natural trail.
- Takachihogawara**
A steep slope down from Naka Peak, with broken rock, and then back to the trail. When you leave the forest you are at Takachiogawara.
- Mt. Takachiho**
From Takachihogawara, take the old shrine path and turn right at the ruins. Climb through the lava field and halfway around the crater. Climb again to the apex.
